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Overview

"Internet" allows you to set up the settings required for chreos to communicate with other systems via the internet.

Details Displayed

- **Outwards mail**. This sets you up to send e-mails from within Chreos to other users and/or systems, for example the Chreos support team (on "Help | E-mail support").
 - **SMTP Server** (ie smtp.myisp.co.nz) The address of the users ISP (Internet Service Provider), for sending e-mail to, for example smtp.xtra.co.nz. This may also refer to a proxy server if one is being used.
 - **Port (Out going SMTP mail)** The port to use for sending e-mail. The default is 25.
- **Inwards mail**. This allows you to receive e-mail from within Chreos from external sources. These items only need to be set if Chreos itself will receive e-mail. An example is a head office receiving branch transactions through email.
 - **POP3 Server (ie pop3.myisp.co.nz)**. The address of your ISP's email server, for example pop3.xtra.co.nz.
 - **Port** (**Inwards POP3 mail**). The port to use for receiving e-mail. The default is 110.
 - User Name & Password. Used to log on and receive e-mail from you ISP. These are supplied by your ISP when your e-mail account is set up.
- **FTP Settings**. (File Trade Protocol.) These allow Chreos to connect to the Wild Software Limited web site and download new files, updated information sheets and reports etc.
 - **Port**. The port that is used for FTP transfers. The default is 21. This is the only value required for FTP unless a proxy server/firewall is being used.

- **Proxy**. The address for the proxy. For example, myproxy.mydomain or 127.10.01.112. This is only required if you are using a proxy server/firewall and you should consult your network administrator for this setting.
- **Proxy Port**. The port in the proxy that is used. This is only required if you are using a proxy server/firewall and you should consult your network administrator for this setting.

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
